Dear Friends,

Those of you who attend worship regularly will know of my interest in numbers — not so much the numbers reflecting our income as a congregation, or even our budget. They seldom get mentioned in sermons. Not that I am at all averse to making reference to this — and some recent sermons will attest to that fact.

I am referring to other numbers — statistics about our society, and the way in which these measure change in our habits and practices as a society. As a newcomer to this society and culture, I am intrigued by some of the directions in which we have grown and some of the ways in which we have changed. When I came to this country 30 years ago it was clear that the church was a cornerstone of American life. That, of course, has been true for centuries. But I could sense that 30 years ago — even in New England!! But there has been a great deal of change on this "church front" in the past 30 years!


One of the reports I receive regularly comes from the Barna Group. In reading one recently, I noticed that they reaffirmed one consistent feature of the American scene: most Americans identify as Christian. Let me quote some of these statistics from a recent report:

Debates continue to rage over whether the United States is a "Christian" nation. Some believe the Constitution gives special treatment or preference to Christianity, but others make their claims based on sheer numbers—and they have a point: Most

people in this country identify as Christian. Almost three-quarters of Americans (73%) say they are a Christian, while only one-fifth (20%) claim no faith at all (that includes atheists and agnostics). A fraction (6%) identify with faiths like Islam, Buddhism, Judaism or Hinduism, and 1 percent are unsure. Not only do most Americans identify as Christian, but a similar percentage (73%) also agree that religious faith is very important in their life (52% strongly agree + 21% somewhat agree).

Before we get too smug about the 73% who say they are Christian, we need to look more closely at that number. Barna considers a person who attends worship once a month, and says their faith is important in their life, to be a "practicing Christian." When this is applied, a more accurate picture of Christian faith emerges, with only 31% falling into this classification.

Let me offer one more useful metric. I do it by way of a graphic from the Barna report. It speak for itself:



These may seem like cold statistics, but they remind us of the challenges we face as a small congregation trying to reach out to some of the "dormant" or "dechurched" persons formerly affiliated with DeBows, as well as the community at large. Some of the recent changes we have made are as much for "others" as they are for "us." And will require

our patience in the process. Amid the challenges there is some Good News. Of all the people who attend church, 46% attend churches with fewer than 100 members.

In the face of all this, we need to heed the scriptures which sets out our course for us: "Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness." (1 Tim 6:11). A good word in any season.



# Counseling Corner by Donna Ridge

"A bruised reed he will not break and a smoldering wick He will not snuff out" Isaiah 42:3 (NIV)

I often use this scripture, as it is one of my favorites and shows the heart of God. In the past, I facilitated a class called "Healing of Damaged Emotions. The text I used was a book by David Seamands of the same name. A strange thing happened to me when I was starting the class.

My grandson was nineteen years old and he wanted to find his father. I promised him when he was six that I would help him when he was ready. So after trying to find him on People Search, I got the bright idea to go on MySpace and Facebook. To my surprise I got an email from a woman saying that she thought that I was her aunt. My biological father lives in Michigan. He has three other children that I met once. My brother Mike's daughter contacted me. She said that she remembered my one and only visit to Michigan.

She was excited that she found me again. It was very touching that she remembered since it had been twenty-eight years since my visit and she was very young at the time. Around the same time I also reconnected with some of my cousins on my mother's side. It was as if we never lost touch and was good to reminisce.

Why am I talking about this? The reason, obviously, was God was healing a part of my emotions once again. Though I was facilitating the class, He had work to do in me.

Isaiah 28: "precept upon precept, precept upon precept, lines upon line, line upon line, here a little, there a little" (KJV).

I have had emotional healing over the years, but I have not arrived. Thank God His Spirit is always at work in us to bring us to the place He wants us to be.

The ladies in the class will tell that it was uncomfortable at times to face unpleasant memories that have damaged us in some way, either relationally, spiritually, or physically. Our God is a gentle loving God who was there at the time of our distress and continues on the path with us always and always causes us to triumph.

Today you may be dealing with some emotional wound, divorce, loss of a loved one, loss of a job, being alienated from someone you care about, dealing with a rebellious child, the list can go on and on. Whatever it is we all know to take it to prayer and I tell my counselees to put a word on it from the Word. Whenever Satan rears his ugly head to tell you a lie, we can follow the example of our precious Savior and say "It is written" and I believe it.

# **Hymn Story**

#### A Mighty Fortress Is Our God

Martin Luther, circa 1527-1529 - UMH #110

On October 31<sup>st</sup>, much of America will celebrate Halloween. Consumer spending for this holiday is second only to Christmas. But for Protestants worldwide October 31st has a far greater meaning. On this date in 1517, Martin Luther, an Augustinian monk who increasingly found himself at odds with many of the teachings and practices of the Roman Catholic Church, posted his 95 Theses (complaints) on the door of the Cathedral of Wittenberg in This effectively launched the Germany. Protestant Reformation. In our church calendar, October 31<sup>st</sup> is known as Reformation Day and the Sunday before or on this date is known as Reformation Sunday.

Luther became known in particular for three things: the doctrine of salvation by faith alone, the belief that Scripture was the central source of religious authority and should be translated into the people's language (which he did), and the birth of congregational singing. Luther had strong convictions about the use and power of sacred music. He once wrote, "I would allow no man to preach or teach God's people without a proper knowledge of the use and power of sacred song."

It was in circa 1527-1529 that Martin Luther wrote "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God", which has often been called "The Battle Hymn of the Reformation". Written while Luther was effectively in exile (decreed by Pope Leo X), the words are a paraphrase of Psalm 46 and reflect Luther's deep misgivings about the Roman Papacy.
