

NATIVE AMERICAN MINISTRIES SUNDAY

On April 30th, the United Methodist Church celebrates Native American Ministries Sunday. To help observe this event, DeBows will have a "POTLATCH" meal on Sunday, April 30th, after the worship service. "Potlatch" is a gift-giving feast practiced by Indians of the Pacific Northwest Coast of Canada and the United States. A "Potlatch" meal is similar to what we call a potluck dinner. If you wish to give a gift, please use the envelope for Native Americans in the bulletin during the worship service.

Look for a signup sheet for our meal on the table outside the fellowship hall. All are welcomed to join together in sharing a meal and enjoying each other's fellowship.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

After the delightful weather in February, we have all been experiencing an element of March Madness concerning the weather. With weather changing rather quickly, and some disappointing weather over the weekends, we can see the impact of weather on our worship patterns. Of course, we know it is not only the weather. Many are simply busy, or travelling, or have been experiencing some health issues for themselves or their families. But clearly, bad weather does not help. This is reflected in our attendance record for the first three months of this year. Our average weekly attendance for 2016 was 41. For January it was 39; for February it was 30. So far for March it is 33. This must give us all some pause as we reflect on our church family. And its future.

In recent weeks our focus has been on matters of faith. "A Study in Blindness." "A Journey Toward Faith." "A Model Faith." "Leaning Our Weight On God." In different ways all of these have focused on how our relationship with God not only helps us depend on God, but enables us to become partners with God in sharing the Good News. This serves to remind us that the future of DeBows is in God's hands – but God has some helpers. And we are the one's God is relying on.

I find myself often reflecting on the question: "How do people find their way to church?" Thankfully there is some research that answers part of that question for us:

 2% of people come to church for the first time because they have a specific need or crisis – death, marriage and baptism. It is amazing how many people gravitate to the church in these pivotal times: to be hatched, matched or dispatched.

- 2% come because of door-to-door evangelism, or large campaigns or crusade evangelism, etc.
- 3% come to a church because they **just walked** in.
- 5% come because of **Sunday School** or other youth or educational programs.
- 6% come and stay because of the sermon. [A bruising statistic given the time and attention we preachers give to our sermons! We are clearly not the draw card!]
- 79% begin attending a local congregation because someone invited them. A person they knew and trusted said "Come to church with me this Sunday." And they come. By far the most common reason for people coming to church is because someone invited them.

As we get closer to Easter, it may be helpful to be praying about who God would want us to invite to worship with us - on Easter, but also the Sundays before and after Easter. This is the time when we celebrate resurrection and new life. In this celebration there is also the reminder that what God did for the Son is something God promises for all who follow Jesus. As we have been invited into the arena of grace, let us be among those who invite others. This is a good time to "invite" people we know are not connected with a church to join with us in worship. Easter affords us the opportunity to gently confront people about God's "gracious acceptance" of all who come to be among us. By our acceptance of them we model Christ's acceptance of all of us!

Please join us during the special services planned for this holy season (see front page of this newsletter for schedule), and be prayerful about who God wants you to invite.

Thursday, May 18 - AARP will conduct a



Red Bird Missionary Conference

Collection of the "Labels for Education" that are found on some food items. This has been a tremendous help to the Red Bird Mission. Due to changes in this program, collection of these labels will stop in May 2017.

Collection of the "Box Tops for Education", which is a totally different program. This program provides the Red Bird Mission with real money for the redemption of the box tops. We will continue to collect them going forward.

The Red Bird Missionary Conference is located in Southeastern Kentucky and is the most comprehensive mission effort of the United Methodist Church in the United States. They will be able to use these labels/box tops to purchase needed items for the school they run (pre-school to high school). COUNSELING CORNER BY DONNA RIDGE

As most of you know, I have been helping my son to raise my grandson for almost eight years. His mother left when he was not quite three. Contact has been off and on over the years. Recently she seems to have settled down and is calling more often. In conversation, when I have told her how well he is doing her answer is, "That's my boy!" I have to confess that It was annoying. My flesh rose up thinking, "Really? Where have you been all these years?"

The Lord convicted me that yes he is her boy. She is his mother. Half his DNA is from her.

Having said that I want to address grandparents raising their grandchildren, single parents and step parents. We have been given the awesome privilege and responsibility of being part of forming and teaching these children. We have to remember that the noncustodial parent in fact may also have influence and indeed is biologically part of the child.

Therefore, I caution you to be careful about how you speak about the absent parent. You may not care for them, but the child, whether or not they see the other parent or parents, may have a different perspective and feeling about that person.


For a long time my grandson blamed me. All he knew was that he went to bed with Mommy there and woke up to Grandmom being there. In his little mind, I chased her away. It took years and his maturing for him to accept the truth. He is able to understand that it was her

choice. I always tell him people make choices we don't understand, but she loves him.

I am suggesting all of this, because we can have times of exasperation and want to lash out and negatively compare the children to the other parent or absent parents. Recently, in a Bible study, we were talking about sticks and stones breaking our bones, but words will never hurt me. Oh YES they can! Many times I have spoken to adults who were told negative things and it wounded them emotionally.

If you have been guilty of speaking harshly, or negatively, repent and apologize. I hold myself to this rule with my grandson and though it doesn't happen too often there is no excuse. We are the adults and they are watching us to be an example. If this is an area that you struggle with, be accountable as we continue and struggle to become more like Him. Bring it to Him in prayer or ask a friend to help you. There is no condemnation, we all have our struggles. God bless you all.
